A child is never too young to be affected when a parent is diagnosed with cancer. Just as an adult can benefit from professional intervention, children can benefit from working and playing with professionals who understand how they respond to their parent's illness.

Children's Lives Include Moments of Bravery (CLIMB) is a four-week program designed for children whose parent or primary caregiver has cancer. Children attend the program each week with their parent or a special caregiver. Each session focuses on a select topic and incorporates activities for children and a support group for parents. All sessions for children are facilitated by health care professionals who are experienced in the care of families coping with cancer.
